7:00 PM Program: Mark Ivan Jacobson is a geologist-minerologist specializing in pegmatites. He obtained a BS mineralogy-geochemistry from Pennsylvania State University in 1973 and a MS in sedimentary geology from the University of California at Berkeley in 1976. He is currently the president of the National Friends of Mineralogy and was the past president of the Colorado Chapter. Mark has published numerous articles and published several books.

The presentation Mark will be giving will be on the Collecting History of Mount Antero in Chaffee County, Colorado. The first documented collection of aquamarines found by "Nels" Nelson Daniel Wanemaker in 1885. A successful miner was James D Endicott from Canon City. In May of 1969 Grady Cardwell reclaimed the entire south knob of Mount Antero. Craig Cardwell has taken over the family mining and is the owner and operator of Mount Antero Treasures which focuses on just aquamarines. .
